

Three and a half years ago, I picked up my family and moved across the state. I didn't know exactly what it was going to look like, but I knew we needed to do something to address the gap in services for adult survivors of human trafficking. Together, Brooke Burris and I sat around the kitchen table and began to ask ourselves how we could respond to the need in the Tri-County.

We never could have imagined the incredible growth the next three years would bring, but more importantly the many survivors' lives that would be impacted as a result. Starting a non-profit in a global pandemic was risky and we knew we had to adapt and immediately start meeting the needs of survivors in our community. Nothing could have prepared me for the strength and resillience I would witness each day from the people we serve.




Our Vision & Mission & Programs

Our Vision is a world where no person is bought, sold, or exploited.

Our Mission is to build a resilient community free from exploitation.

Our programs are designed to be trauma-informed and driven by our participants' individual needs. We recognize that every survivor has different needs and goals. We welcome survivors to join us at any and every part of their healing journey. We expect ups and downs, relapses and recovery. We believe that relationship is the conduit to lasting healing and we support that through our thriving peer community. For 2022, there was an average of 18 active participants monthly in our programs, primarily female, with an average participant age of 38 years old.



Emergency Shelter

Many survivors find themselves in a crisis situation in which they are ready to leave their trafficker and exploitation but they have nowhere safe to go. Our Crisis Intervention and Emergency Shelter program is designed to address that crisis. Our partners, particularly Law Enforcement, view this service as an asset to our community. This is how we intervene in a trauma-informed, safe way - meeting survivors' most basic needs and helping them stabilize so they can begin to heal.



Case Management

Case management is based on survivors' individual needs. Survivors are paired with a case manager who they work with closely to achieve their goals. We prioritize the relationship between case managers and their participants because, again, we recognize that healing happens through relationship. Case management can happen in coffee shops, ER's, the drop-in center and anywhere else a survivor is in need. Case management is foundational and our case managers are essential to TFP's success.

Peer Community & Drop-in Center

Community and peer support is identified by our survivors as the most supportive service TFP offers. We meet weekly for peer support group, where we share a meal and share our lives. TFP hosts community events and survivors engage with each other on our group messaging app. We provide the structure so that survivors can lift each other up and join together in building back their lives.







Moving Forward

Formation House, is a home for survivors to support the transition from exploitation to independence, using the evidence-based model of a democratically-run housing structure.

Mentorship Program is a strong, healthy community as connections are key to reducing the vulnerabilities that make survivors at-risk of exploitation. Modeled after AA's evidence-based sponsorship, the mentorship program will increase healing and connection, connecting new participants with participants who have graduated case management.
